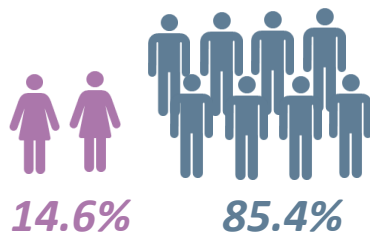


Following the implementation of the National Information System on unaccompanied minors (SIM), in accordance with article 9 of Italian Law n. 47 of 7 April 2017, a database containing relevant information on unaccompanied minors (UAMs) is currently available. As of 31 March 2023, **19,640** UAMs are located in Italy

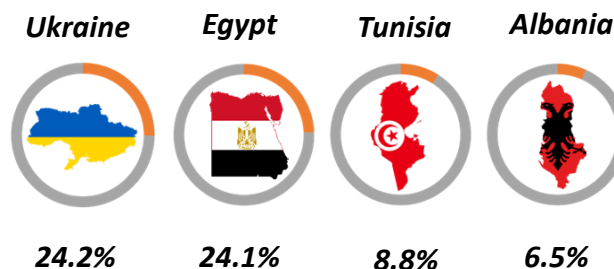
WHAT IS THEIR GENDER?



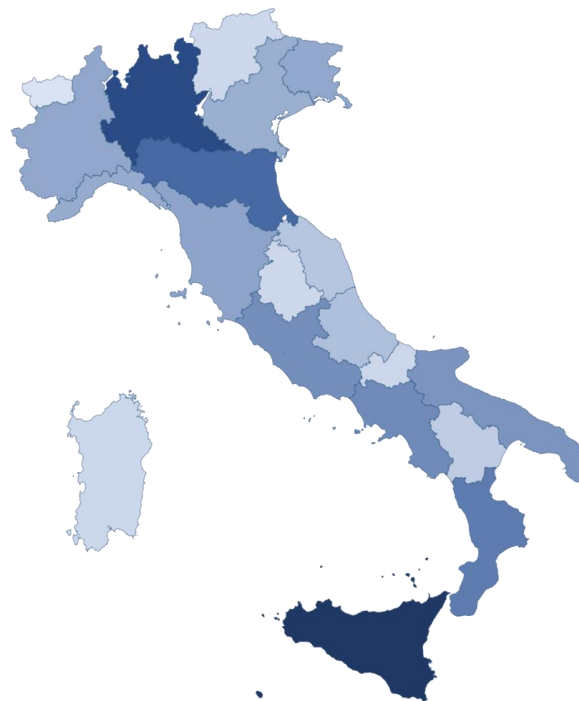
WHAT IS THEIR AGE?

Sicily is the region with the **highest presence rate** of UAMs- **20.6%** of the total; followed by **Lombardy** and **Emilia-Romagna**, respectively with **13.8%** and **8.9%** of the total.

MONTHLY QUOTA OF NEW ARRIVALS

During the month of March 2023, **1,601** UAMs entered Italian territory

27% from **Egypt**
12.9% from **Guinea**
10.7% from **Tunisia**
9.7% from **Ivory Coast**

HOW DID THEY ARRIVE?

Found on territory by Italian authorities sea arrivals



Notably, UAMs' sea arrivals during March 2023 represent about 66% of all the minors that were reported entering Italian territory.
