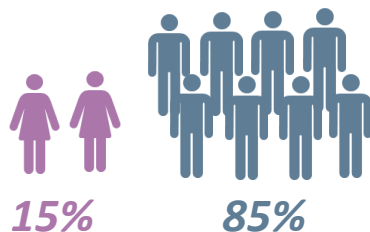


Following the implementation of the National Information System on unaccompanied minors (SIM), in accordance with article 9 of Italian Law n. 47 of 7 April 2017, a database containing relevant information on unaccompanied minors (UAMs) is currently available. As of 31 January 2023, **19.333** UAMs are located in Italy

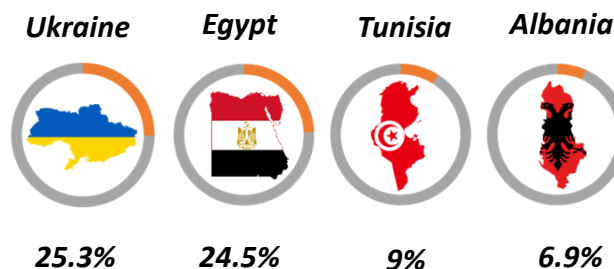
WHAT IS THEIR GENDER?



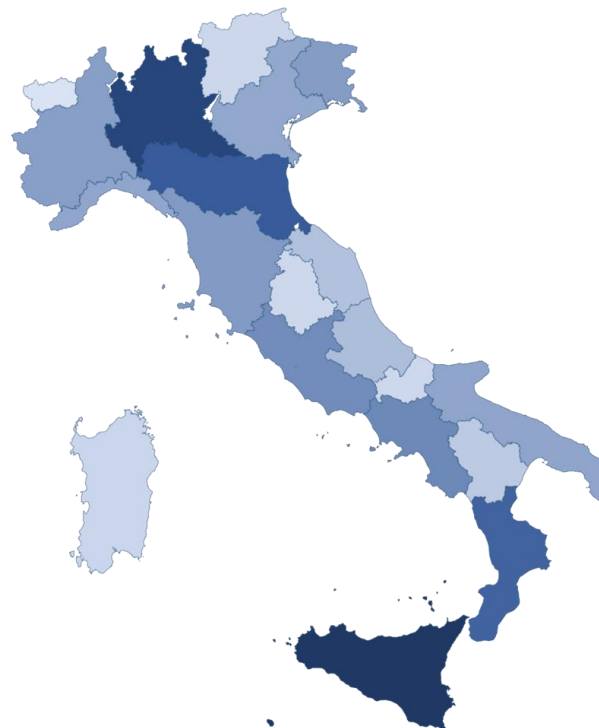
WHAT IS THEIR AGE?

Sicily is the region with the **highest presence rate** of UAMs- **19.1%** of the total; followed by **Lombardy** and **Emilia-Romagna**, respectively with **14.6%** and **9.2%** of the total.

MONTHLY QUOTA OF NEW ARRIVALS

During the month of January 2023, **1.188** UAMs entered Italian territory

24,5% from **Egypt**
11.3% from **Afghanistan**
9.8% from **Guinea**
7.8% from **Tunisia**

HOW DID THEY ARRIVE?

Found on territory by Italian authorities sea arrivals



Notably, UAMs' sea arrivals during January 2023 represent about 37% of all the minors that were reported entering Italian territory.
